Pay Tribute to our Working Americans

"Every first Monday of September marks Labor Day, but do we even really know what that means? Labor Day is a day we pay tribute to the achievements of workers. As a result of the Industrial Revolution, many workers in the 1700-1800s were working long hours and in dangerous conditions to make ends meet.

Some of these workers were children as young as 5 or 6 years old. There were no laws protecting workers from unsafe conditions. Children were not protected to have a safe, carefree childhood or a right to education. As a result, labor unions grew more vocal, organizing strikes and rallies to support workers against these conditions. Teachers, doctors, leaders and activists fought for children to belong in schools, not factories

The first Labor Day parade was celebrated in 1882, but it wasn't legalized as a worker's holiday until 1894. It's a day to commemorate those who have built and continue to build our communities. It is also a great reminder of how far we have come in protecting the rights of children so that they may have the chance to thrive in environments the support childhood, learning, and growth without the burdens of labor.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH BAKERY STYLE FRESH CRANBERRY MUFFINS

Ingredients:

For the Muffins

- 2 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 1/4 cup granulated white sugar
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ½ cup vegetable oil
- 2 large eggs (lightly beaten)
- 3/4 cup milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup fresh or frozen cranberries

For the Streusel Topping

- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 3 tablespoons granulated white sugar
- 3 tablespoons butter (cut into cubes)
- 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon



Direction

Get prepped

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. Prepare a muffin tin by lining with paper muffin cups or spray with non-stick spray.

Make the batter

- 1.In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, sugar, baking powder and salt.
- 2. Make a well in the center of the dry ingredients and add the oil, beaten eggs, milk and vanilla. Stir just until everything is combined.
- 3. Fold in the cranberries and then scoop the batter into the muffin tin filling them right to the top.

Make the Streusel Topping

1. To make the streusel topping, combine the flour, sugar, cinnamon and butter in a small bowl. With your fingers, work the butter into the dry ingredients until it resembles crumbs.

Bake

- 1. Sprinkle the streusel on the tops of the muffins then place on the center rack of the oven to bake.
- 2. Bake for 28-30 minutes until lightly golden and a toothpick comes out clean.
- 3. Allow to cool and then move to an airtight container for storage.
