



CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTERS (CDC)

offers full-day and hourly child care for children (six weeks to five years old) and is available at Kūpūlau and Laulima Child Development Centers on MCBH. The program is offered at below cost for Marines and their families; there may be a waitlist because it is very popular.



IN-HOME CARE — FAMILY CHILD CARE

(FCC) *provides child care in housing owned or leased by the government and under the control of the installation commander. FCC Providers are private contractors certified and monitored by the command.*

FCC Providers offer flexible child care hours and small, intimate environments for children's early development. The FCC Program holds DoD certification and participates in the USDA Child and Adult Care Food Program.

SCHOOL AGE CARE (SAC) *offers organized and supervised recreational, educational, and social activities for children ages five to 12 or those attending kindergarten through sixth grade. SAC also offers summer camps and full-day care, Monday to Friday on Mokapu Elementary's non-school days.*

TRANSITIONING TO CIVILIAN LIFE

TRANSITION READINESS PROGRAM (TRP)

a MANDATORY week-long program required for all active duty and reserve Marines who have served a minimum of 180 consecutive days on active duty. Marines are encouraged to begin TRS within 12 to 18 months of their End of Active Service (EAS) or within 24 months of their retirement.


